
Lake Tahoe Boating Map

Danger Buoy: shallow water and rocks shoreward. Keep between you and shore at all times.

Lake Tahoe Boating Rules & Regulations:

- No Wake Zone 600ft from shore
- No Carbureted 2-Stroke Engines
- All vessels must pass inspection before gaining access to Lake Tahoe
- All vessels must comply with USGC regulations


North Shore (clockwise):

Carnelian Bay – Sierra Boat Co., Garwoods; Tahoe Vista – Capt. Jon's; Kings Beach – Coon St. Ramp; Incline Village – IVGID ramp, Hyatt.

East Shore: Sand Harbor ramp; Cave Rock ramp; Zephyr Cove

Lake Tahoe Info & Weather: Lake Tahoe, 6225', is a freshwater lake with a depth of 1645'. The Nevada/California border bisects the lake, and there are 5 counties surrounding it. The US Coast Guard also patrols Tahoe. Summer water temperatures range from 60's in early June to mid-high 70's in late August. Typically the mornings are calm, suitable for watersports; the wind often picks up in the afternoon, making waters rough and boating hazardous for small vessels.

Channels: Red Right Returning



South Shore: El Dorado Ramp; Casinos; Lakeside Marina; Tahoe Keys Marina; Camp Richardson; Emerald Bay

West Shore: Meeks Bay Marina; Chambers Landing; Obexers/Homewood; Sunnyside; Tahoe City – Tahoe Water Adventures, Tahoe City Marine Supply, Tahoe City Marina; Lake Forest Ramp, USCG station.
